## Nursery Room News

### Green Room news

In the Green Room we started September off with looking at the theme, 'All about me'.

The children explored different textures and malleable play using their senses, getting to know themselves and their bodies. We shared our family photos and looked at story books about families and people who are important to us.

We made lots of different arts, including collaging people and adding their own faces to the people and using the opportunity to talk about colour by looking at our hair colour and eyes in the mirrors.



In October we celebrated Harvest Festival, Autumn and Halloween. We explored harvest vegetables and used them in painting and our soil tuff tray. The children made patterns in different malleable materials using tractors and tools. The children explored natural materials such as leaves and sticks to develop their awareness of Autumn and the change of the season. For Halloween, we dressed up in different outfits and did various art activities. Such as hand printing spiders and pumpkin painting.



We celebrated the festival of Diwali with firework pictures and making diva lamps. This linked in well to November and Bonfire night.

In November, we celebrated Bonfire night. We made our own bonfire paintings and edible sparklers. We looked at colour and light as part of this theme using coloured fabrics and torches. We filled the rest of the month focusing on what the children really enjoyed the most, using their interests as a guide to our activities- such as Peppa Pig and favourite stories and songs.

In December, we celebrated Christmas with lots of fun activities



such as making Christmas cards, enjoying Christmas music and baking Christmas treats. We had an interactive Christmas tree the children could use. The children dressed up in their Christmas Jumpers for Christmas jumper day and also had a yummy Christmas dinner.



Thank you to those who have brought in treats for the nursery guinea pigs. We have enjoyed having them for some time in the Green Room and they are now all cosy at Michelle's house ready for the Christmas break and colder weather.

We look forward to welcoming new children and families this New Year and wish our children moving to Red Room in January and February all the best on their next adventure.

### Red room news

During the summer the children had the chance to explore different materials and develop their communication skills as well as their imaginative skills by doing a range of different activities such as car track painting, 'muddy' Oobleck farm animals and water painting.

We also had a lot of fun outdoors, doing water play, sports day activities and lots of garden time.





The children also celebrated Halloween by doing lots of messy play activities and developing their fine motor skills by doing these activities, such as jelly play, rice



and pasta play with tweezers, vegetable print painting and they also played with a 'spooky' Halloween village.



Red room have been enjoying celebrating Christmas this month and have developed skills such as understanding the concept of Christmas, using motor skills and they progressed their communication and language skills by doing activities such as Christmas sticking, snowball parachute, snowman water tray, large scale Winter Wonderland pictures and Winter dance sessions.

### Blue room news

During December in blue room, we had a truly magical time entering the world of Christmas and winter wonderland.



We had a range of physical activities, playing in our igloo tent with white shredded paper and our teddies pretending to be a polar bear in a cave.

The children have enjoyed creating their own creative artwork, from elf hats, reindeer antlers and Christmas baubles.





We have done lots of fun movement times, party dances and focus ball rolling into Rudolph's nose.

The children have enjoyed baking, and they were excited to do a cake sale for their parents to buy the sweet dreams they made.
